Dear Parents,

It is now getting colder and with the winter weather closing in it is noticeable that more people are driving to the school drop off and pick up. This has seen complaints rise and I am writing to you to make you aware of some of the issues.

There have been complaints about parking outside of the school on Higher Broad Lane with some drivers parking across private driveways and in the bus stop. Please note that parking in this way causes problems for others and could also be an offence of obstruction. The bus stop is NOT for general parking.

To prevent this happening you may need to park further away or arrive earlier so bear this in mind when you set off.

At the end of the day we all want the children to get into school and home again safely.

The Council schools Parking Enforcement Officers are regularly patrolling schools and will issue fixed penalty notices should you park illegally, so please be warned..

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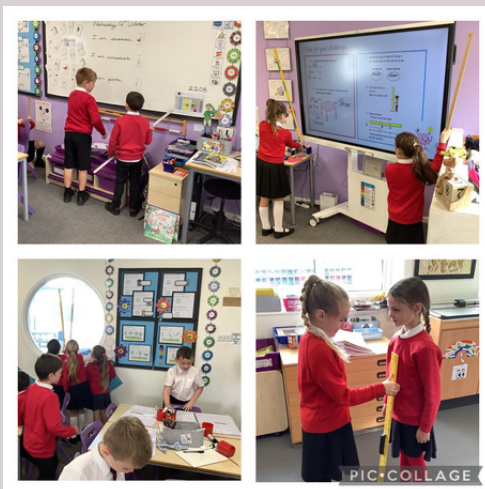


Year 1

The children enjoyed measuring themselves and other objects in the classroom before sorting the objects into 'less than one metre' or 'greater than one metre'. The children know that there are 100cm in 1m. They are looking forward to continuing their learning by measuring in meters and centimetres and converting between the two.

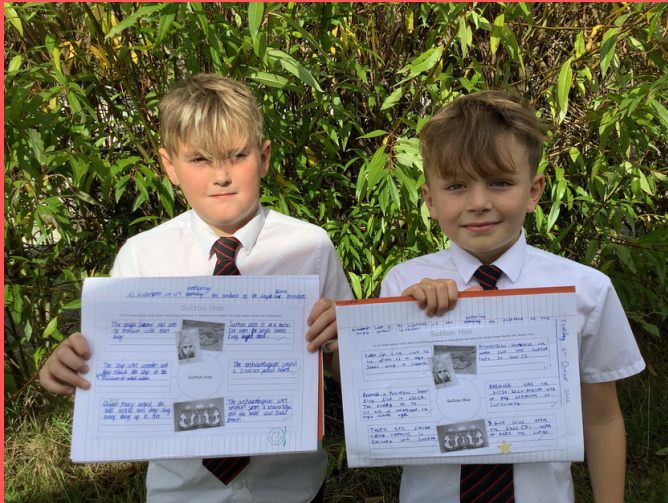


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Year 4
