



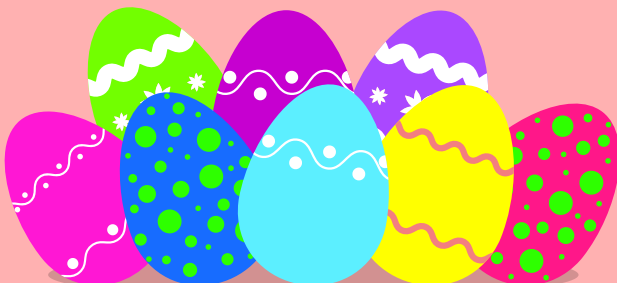

In computing this week, year 3 have been learning how to code. We explored building two different sequences and using a chaining method for our code.



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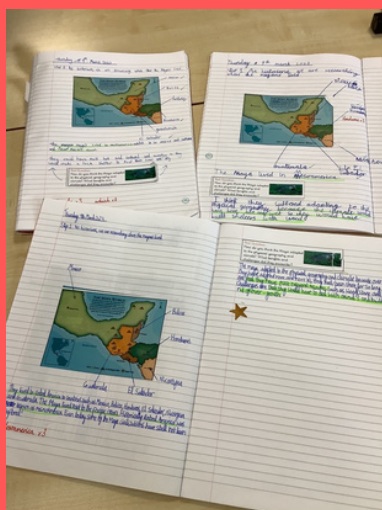
Year 4

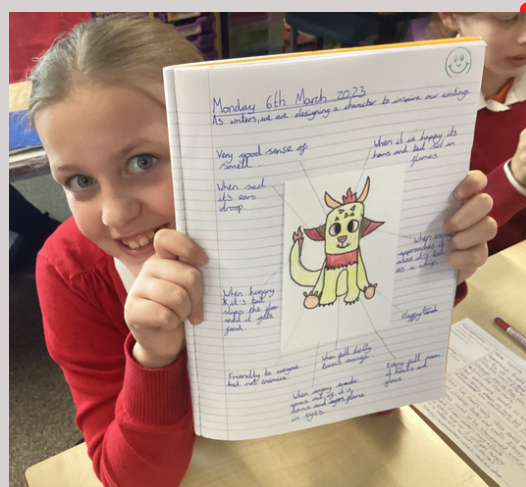
Year 5

Today, the children came up with some key information on how to look after their animal.
