I led a core session on Reading Fluency, this is a new project to us here at Treloweth but one that has already seen some incredible results. There were a variety of workshops and the feedback from teachers has been exceptionally positive. These top tips will be trialled in classrooms; 'better never stops!'

On Tuesday, KS2 children were visited by 'Rice and Peas' for an assembly. They spoke about diversity within a historical context and the events that led to the Windrush generation. The children's knowledge in Year 6 was incredible and the visitors were super impressed by the depth of their learning. They also sang songs about being part of one community. They talked about inspirational historical figures from the black community including Nelson Mandela and Mohammad Ali.

Rainbows and Sunbeams



In Year 4, we have begun our new Science topic looking at Sound. This week, we discussed how sounds are made and how they travel from an object, to our ears through vibrations.







Year 5

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CALLING ALL SURFERS IN YEARS 4, 5 AND 6.

Can you swim 25 metres? Have you always wanted to surf? Then this could be the club for you!

Previously we have facilitated a Surf Club through Global Boarder Surf School at Gwithian Beach in the Summer Term.

Treloweth have again been offered the opportunity to access this club again, but sadly we won't be able to use the minibus to provide transport. The club will be led by the team from Global Boarders, Treloweth staff will not be present.

Here is some information about the club itself:

What Will You Learn?

Aside from learning how to surf, or developing your surfing ability further, your child will learn several key skills associated with surfing, including lifeguarding, fitness, oceanography and environmental awareness. Learning and understanding these skills could save lives in the future! On the final session each student will be awarded a certificate celebrating their progress throughout the course.

Afternoon Structure

Students will be transported by parents / car share to Gwithian Beach for 3.45 - 4.00pm. Once at the beach, students will meet their coaches from Global Boarders and will be handed a winter wetsuit and surfboard, everyone then gets changed using our private changing facilities. (please bring your own full length wetsuit should you have one). A 1-½ hour lesson commences (depending on conditions and student fitness). Once finished everyone gets changed and will be ready for parent collection from Gwithian Beach (Sunset Surf Café) for 5.30pm.

What Will You Need?

Your child will need to bring swimwear, a towel/Robie, any medical support e.g. Asthma Pump / EpiPen and fluids. Should you have you own full-length wetsuit, we do advise you bring your own with you. Whilst we do carry some gloves and boots, we cannot always guarantee the right sizes and quantities, so it may be an idea to invest in these if you think your child will need them.

Price

The price is £15.00 per session. We are committed in recognising the current economic climate and our desire to work closely with the community, therefore are able to offer the surf club at 60% less our normal surf lesson prices. We do ask that 100% of the sessions be paid for in advance.

Sessions will begin on Tuesday 18th April and will be weekly, there is an option to sign up for half a term (6 weeks starting in April), or the full term (13 weeks from April to July).
