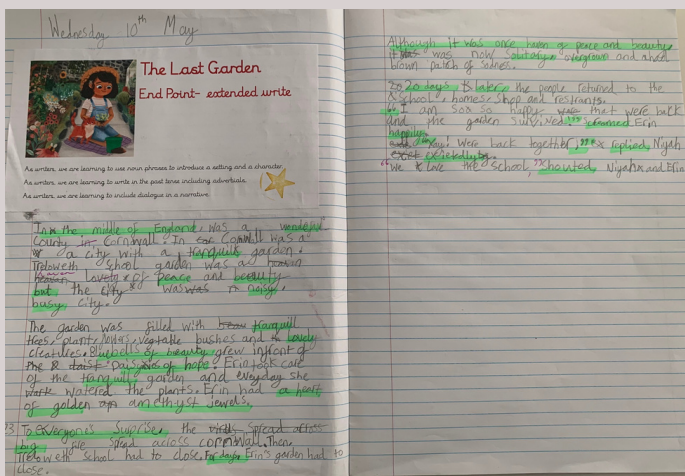
Year 2

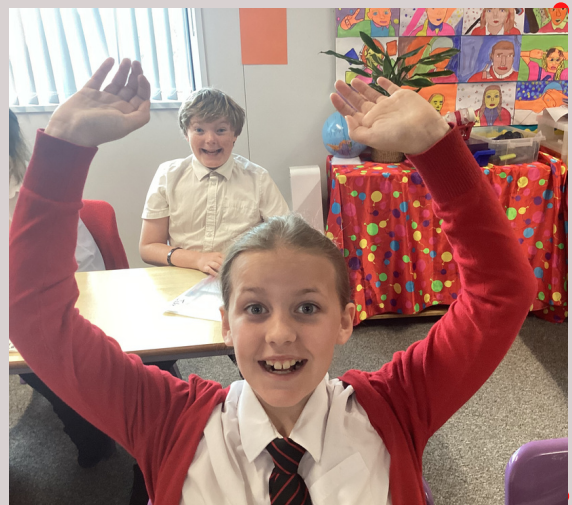


Year 5

Bags 2 Schools

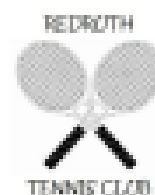
If you are having a summer clear out of preloved clothing or clean bedding/ curtains we are having another collection on June 27th to raise funds. Every kg collected raises money for school.

CLIENT BRIEF

Bumblebee Conservation Trust (BBCT) partnership

Pollinators like bumblebees are essential in the production of our food. Without them, we wouldn't have 30% of the food we eat today.

Chartwells has recently partnered with the Bumblebee Conservation Trust, an organisation which complements our passion for food, sustainability and education. The Trust aims to increase the number and distribution of bumblebees. That's why we are launching a year-long bumblebee campaign, **Bee Happy**, starting with the theme '**Bee the Hero**'. This theme runs through this term and we are providing materials to promote the importance of bumblebees and run a poster competition.

Engaging pupils

Competition

To support World Bee Day (20 May) we want pupils in your school to inspire action to halt the decline of bumblebees. This will be done by pupils designing their own 'How can we Bee Helpful?' poster, sharing their ideas on how we can help bumblebees. There will be one winner in each school, who will receive a badge and a T-shirt. We will be handing poster sheets to your pupils from Monday 15 May – and a winner will be picked on Friday 19 May.

Entries should be handed in to the Unit Manager who will decide the school's winner.

Educational workshops

We have enhanced our Beyond the Chartwells Kitchen Programme by creating exciting 'Flight of the Bumblebee'-themed assemblies and workshops for both KS1 and KS2.

These cover:

- An introduction to bumblebees and BBCT
- Bumblebees' role in pollination and the food cycle
- Exploring bee-pollinated produce (including food activity)
- What we can do to help save the bees

Our workshops during that week will all be 'Flight of the Bumblebee'-themed – please contact your local nutritionist to book a session.

Theme days

We will also be offering a bee-themed menu once a term to ensure that this is an ongoing focus.

Values-led stickers

To be used throughout the year; we'll supply your school with values-led stickers, including Bee Friendly, Bee Kind and Bee Happy, that can be given to pupils when they display these positive bee behaviours.

More to come

We have exciting projects planned for the next academic year to continue to educate and engage children on the importance of bumblebees in our food system, and a more sustainable world.
