## HEAD BUMP INFORMATION

Here at Treloweth, we have designated, trained and prepared first aiders who administer medical care to our pupils. If a serious head injuries occurs, parents will be contacted immediately and asked to come to the school to assess whether the child needs to go home or receive further treatment. In severe cases, emergency services will be contacted if, after assessment, immediate medical attention if deemed necessary.

All incidents are recorded in our first aid book and our qualified first aider will judge the severity of the injury and determine the best way forward, meeting the needs of every individual.

#### Year 1

In geography this week, we have been learning about human and physical features. The children enjoyed walking around the local area spotting human and physical features.

#### Year 2

This week in Year 2 we have been learning about the differences between fiction and non fiction books. Our new focus book in Writing is called 'A book about bears'. We researched facts about bears using different resources: books, leaflets and the internet.





#### Year 3

Year 3 have been bringing our new story to life this week. They acted out a scene from the Pied Piper of Hamelin by Michael Morpurgo. They used their inference skills and descriptions from the text to help them portray the characters accurately.


#### Year 4

This week, Year 4 came together to explore different time signatures in music, focusing on 4/4 and 3/4 rhythms. We listened to Hey Jude by The Beatles to feel the steady 4/4 beat and compared it to a waltz in 3/4 time, which has a swaying rhythm. The students practiced clapping and counting to each time signature

and discussed how the different beats change the feel of the music. It was a fun and engaging way to learn about rhythm and timing!







#### Year 5

This week, Year 5 have been learning about gestation periods in mammals. We've researched the average gestation period in a variety of mammals, spotting patterns as we did, and produced these amazing bar charts to show our results!

#### Year 6

Year 6 have started their electricity unit by making circuits and investigating what happens when more and more components are added.
