Rainbows and Sunbeams

This week in EYFS, we have been comparing groups of objects using the vocabulary 'more than' and 'fewer than'.





Year 1

In English, the children have been learning how to write compound sentences to create opposites. First, the children suggested adjectives to describe how two of the characters from the story 'Lost and Found' were feeling. The children collected these adjectives on their whiteboards to support them with their independent writing.

Year 2

In Year 2, we have been learning about the difference between equal and unequal groups. We used cubes to explore whether or not certain numbers could be broken down in to equal groups or not.
