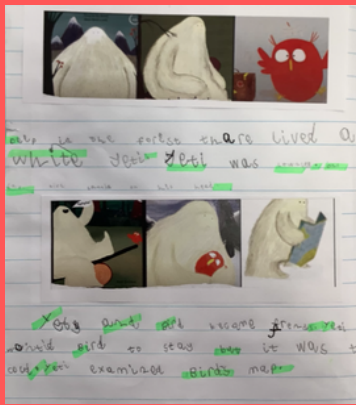

## Rainbows and Sunbeams

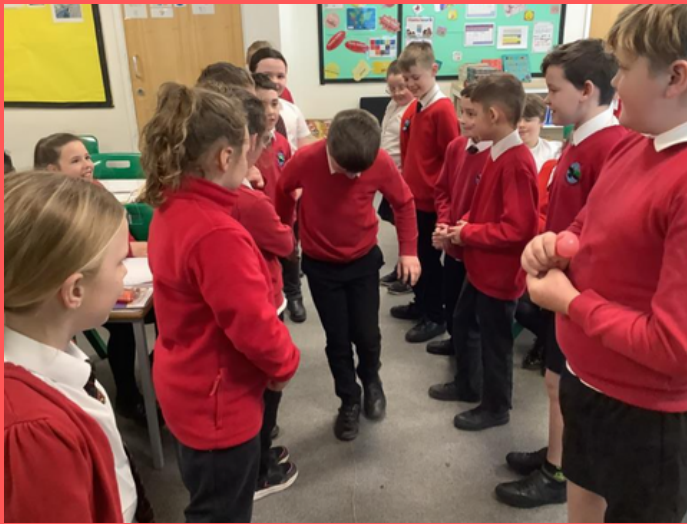
## Year 3

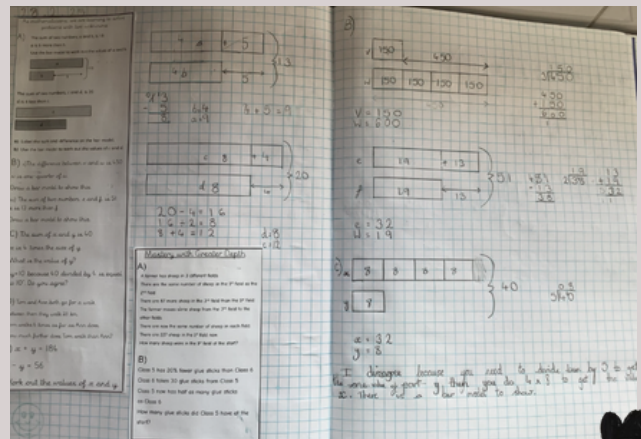


## Year 5
