In Reception we have been scientists using our observation skills to look closely at our daffodil bulbs. We have been excited to see how much they have grown each day and cannot wait until they flower. The first signs of Spring!



Year 1

In R.E. this week, Year 1 have had a great time listening to stories from the bible. The children then reenacted the story of Zacchaeus and performed it to the rest of the class. Great work, Year 1!

Year 2

In Year 2, we carried out a Science experiment to see which habitat a woodlouse would like best out of dry sand, wet soil, damp grass and smooth stones. We found they liked to hide in the wet soil.



Year 3

Year 3 have a great time at Geevor Mine! We learned lots about mining and were excited to go down into the mine.



Year 4

This week in Science, Year 4 became sound engineers! We conducted an exciting investigation to discover which materials are best for muffling sound. Using sponges, tinfoil, kitchen roll, bubble wrap and honeycomb brown paper, the children tested how well each one reduced noise levels. They made predictions and discussed which materials would work best for soundproofing. It was a fantastic hands-on lesson that encouraged curiosity and scientific thinking!



Year 5

Year 5 being scientists separating the different components of a beach through sieving and filtering. All groups successfully processed the substances into three distinct beakers. Further discussion was held around separating the salt from the sea water!

Year 6

Year 6 have been researching the life of Martin Luther King in preparation to write a biography about this key figure in the civil rights movement.
