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

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ACCELERATED READER AT TRELWETH

We're excited to be continuing to use Accelerated Reader this term to support independent reading. After completing the Read Write Inc. programme, children take a Star Reading Test, which helps them find books that are just right for their reading level (ZPD). After reading a book, they complete a short quiz to check their understanding.

Parents can support by encouraging daily reading- a minimum of 10 minutes a day, ideally 15–20 minutes. It's also really helpful to talk with your child about what they've read and encourage them to take their quiz.

✨ Don't forget: children can quiz on books from home or the library- even if they're not in our school collection. You can use Google or AI tools to check if a book is the right level. If you're unsure, just ask your child's teacher.

We love celebrating progress! Whether it's earning a prize from the book vending machine or becoming one of our Millionaire Readers, there's always something to work toward.
