Year 1

This week, the Year 1 children have been practising their arithmetic skills in pairs, using counters to help them solve problems and build confidence with numbers! Great work, Year 1!

In Year 3, we've been learning about north and south poles in magnets. We used bar magnets to see when poles attract and which repel.

Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been combining their creativity in both writing and art. After writing their own poems inspired by rivers, the children used watercolours to paint beautiful river scenes. They then layered their poems over the top of their artwork to create stunning, expressive pieces that showcase both their poetic and artistic talents. Well done, Year 4!
