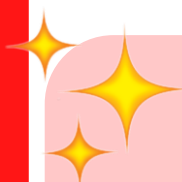

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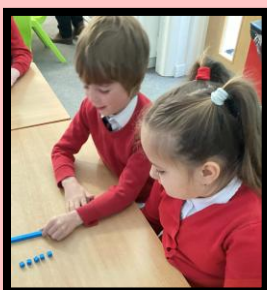
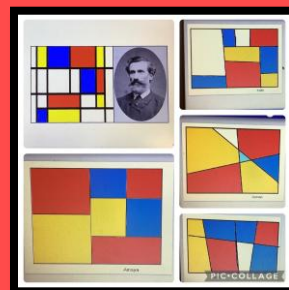


## Rainbows & Sunbeams

This week in Computing, we used the shape, line and fill tool on the PaintZ App to create a piece of art inspired by Piet Mondrian.

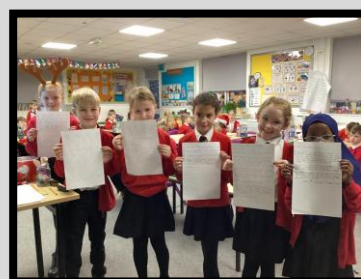


## Year 2
