In the classroom, there has been some fantastic learning taking place. Mr Richards has been working with our wonderful team to develop reading, and the children have been developing their fluency skills, thinking carefully about texts, making predictions, and explaining their ideas with increasing confidence. In writing, we are seeing great progress in sentence structure, vocabulary choices, and creativity, with children taking pride in presenting their work neatly and thoughtfully. In maths, the focus has been on building additive and multiplicative knowledge and using this to support reasoning skills, with pupils becoming more confident in explaining their thinking and tackling a range of problem-solving challenges.

On Wednesday, our Year 5 pupils enjoyed an excellent trip to see The Boy at the Back of the Class at the Hall for Cornwall. Members of staff and the public commented on how well-behaved, respectful, and engaged our children were throughout the visit. We are incredibly proud of them for being such wonderful ambassadors for our school.

Clubs have been very well received this term and are filling up quickly. Many are now full, but there are still a few spaces available—please sign up if your child would like to take part.

We were also delighted to welcome Perran Moon, our local MP, into school this afternoon. During his visit, he took part in a guided tour and met with members of our school council, giving pupils a valuable opportunity to share their ideas and learn more about how they can contribute to their community.

Rainbows and Sunbeams

We have been learning the story The Three Little Pigs in EYFS this week. We have explored different types of houses from around the world and have had a go at making them out of various construction materials.



Year 1

Each day in maths, the children complete the Terrific 10 where they solve 10 addition or subtraction equations on their whiteboards. The children impress us each day with how resourceful and efficient they are at completing this challenge.

Year 2

In Year 2, we have carried on with our learning around 'The Magic Porridge Pot'. In preparation of writing our own adaptation next week, the children explored a WAGOLL (What A Good One Looks Like) and identified the key features that we have been learning about.



Year 3

In Art, Year 3 have been making Ancient Greek pots out of clay.

Year 4

This week, we focused on exploring the key features of a WAGGOL (What A Good One Looks Like) narrative, with the children carefully analysing a model text while also looking closely at specific grammar features, including fronted adverbials, correctly punctuated speech, and 'if, if, if, then' sentences, along with many other techniques used to enhance writing.



Year 5

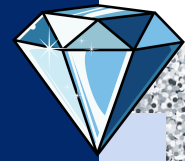

Year 6

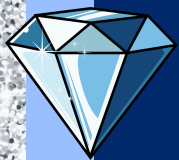

Congratulations to Amari in 1M, who came first place in her dance competition!

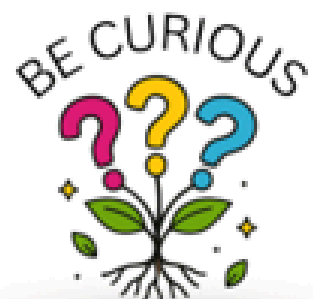
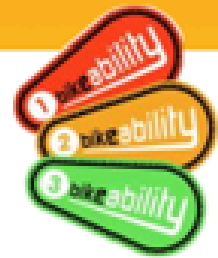


Crofty Sports Events 2025-2026

Treloweth are members of the Crofty Sports Alliance which includes competitions in the following sports: Boys Football, Girls Football, Cross Country, Netball, 3v3 Basketball, Benchball, KS1 Football, Year 3 & 4 Football, Swimming, Dodgeball, T1 Rugby, Cricket, Tennis, Gymnastics, Year 5 & 6 mixed Football, and Golf. Children from Treloweth will also compete in the following Peninsula Competitions: Netball, Football, Quadkids, 3v3 Basketball, T1 Rugby and Gymnastics. The Crofty MAT have the largest number of children in Cornwall attending competitive events.
