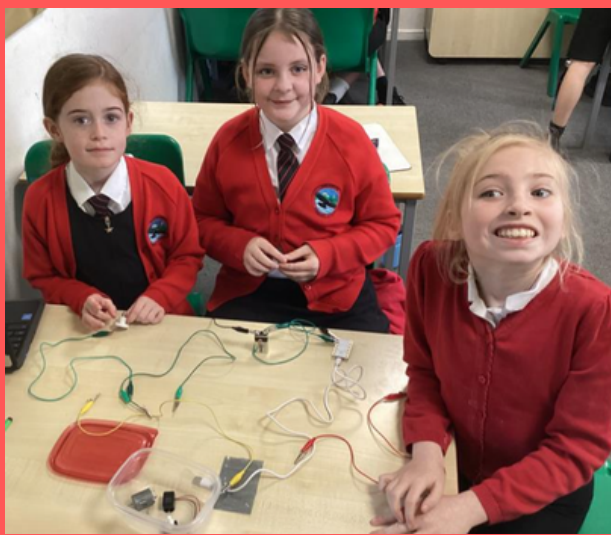


### Year 3

This week, Year 4 have created impressive art masterpieces using recycled materials to convey important messages about protecting the environment.

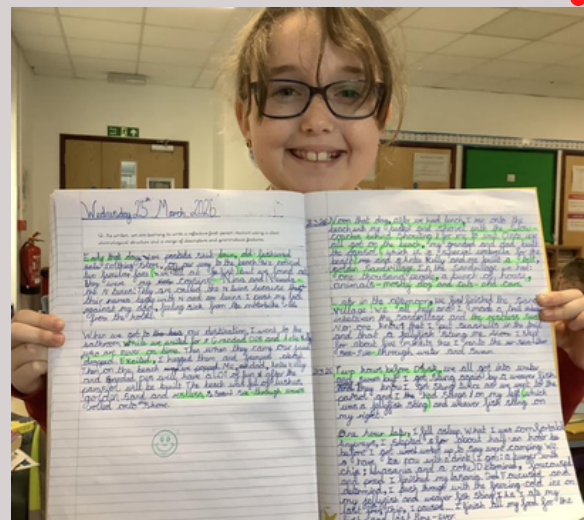


## Year 5
