Rainbows and Sunbeams

Reception have been confidently using part part whole models to represent their understanding of number bonds to 10. Excellent work!



Year 1

In RE, Year 1 have been learning about Christian beliefs by exploring the creation story from the Bible. The children have been sequencing the events and working together to act out each part of the story to deepen their understanding. Great work, Year 1!

Year 2

In Computing, Year 2 have been using Indi robots to explore routines. They created routes mimicking their own movements around the school, programming the robots to adjust their speed depending on the location.



Year 3

In science, Year 3 have been testing different materials as surfaces for a car to roll along. We learned that textured materials cause more friction and make the car travel slower.

Year 4

This week, Year 4 used watercolours to paint their own river scenes. They then wrote their river poem on top to show how it moves and travels.



Year 5



Year 5 and 6 were incredibly lucky to listen to a presentation by Floyd Steadman – ex Saracens rugby captain and current patron of Cornish rugby. Floyd, whose parents were part of the Windrush generation, talked to the children about his journey from growing up in care homes in London to becoming a successful headteacher and rugby player. The children were inspired by his story of perseverance and hard work and it gave the children and staff the great opportunity to reflect on our own unconscious bias and how we treat others who may be different to us. “He was a great inspiration to be kind to others. Year 6

Year 6 were fortunate to welcome the charity RJ Working (Restorative Justice Working), who delivered engaging workshops to support the creation of a presentation about keeping our rivers and seas clean and healthy. This presentation will be shared at Kresen Kernow alongside other local schools. During the sessions, pupils explored what makes rivers and seas healthy, developed their teamwork skills, and learned about the importance of caring for and protecting our natural environment.
