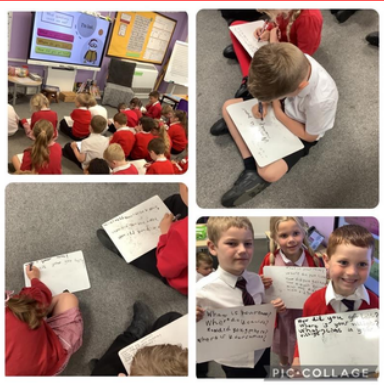
Rainbows and Sunbeams

This week in EYFS, we have been learning about porridge. We learnt about where oats come from and got to taste porridge that we made ourselves.



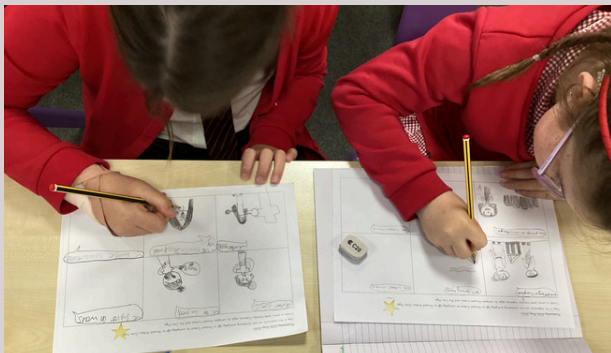
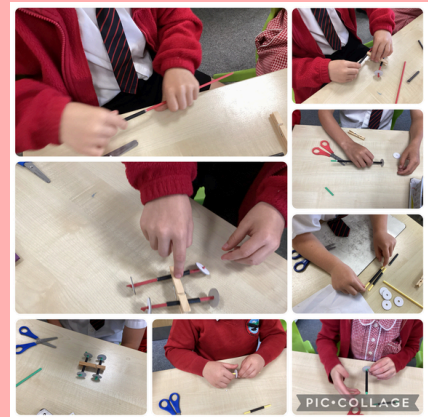
Year 1

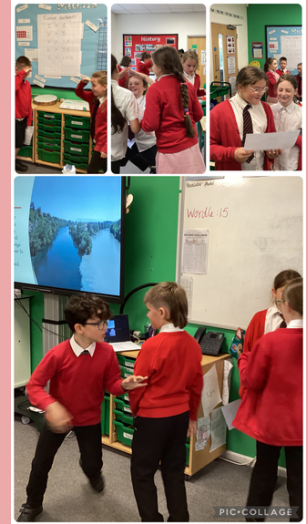


Year 3

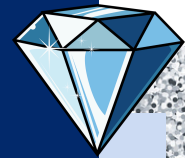


Year 6

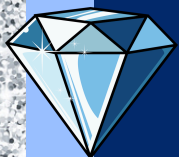
It is finally cricket season for year 6!
